John Bre Gehagan a Citizen of the United States of Ame being duly sworn according to law, saith, that he knows and is well acquainted with Frank a Citizen of the United States of America, the Petitioner; that to his knowledge he has resided in the United States five years, and one year last past in the State of Pennsylvania immediately preceding his application to be a Citizen; that during the said period he has behaved as a man of good moral character attached to the principles of our Constitution, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same. Sworn in open Court, Clerk District Court U. do swear, that the contents of my Petition are true, that I will support the Constitution of the United States, and I now renounce and relinquish any title or order of nobility to which I am now, or hereafter may be entitled, and I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any Foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Iroland, of whom I was
